Resident of the Month: Billy Wiles

Billy Wiles was born in New York City in 1924 to parents from the east coast (Boston and New Jersey). She was an only child. Billy lived in New Canaan, Connecticut with her mother, who didn't organize family gatherings with her in-laws, so Billy never met the cousins on her father's side. While growing up, Billy wrote poetry and stories about her life. Unfortunately, her work was never published. She went to university in Philadelphia and studied English Literature, which may not have been practical, but fed her love of reading.

Billy enjoyed a life filled with travel and homes in many different countries. She met her husband, Don, in Cambridge, Massachusetts at MIT. He received his PhD in chemistry and she worked for an engineering professor. After marrying in 1952, they moved to Norway, where their daughter, Anne, was born. Both Billy and Don loved the lifestyle with it's gorgeous scenery and incredible people. Washing diapers by hand may not have been exciting, but otherwise, it was a great experience. Before they left Norway, the couple took a month-long trip through Europe in a VW Beetle, visiting Finland, Germany, France and Yugoslavia, among other countries. Billy kept a diary of their travels.

Billy and Don moved back to the U.S. for a short time before Don accepted a job at UBC in Vancouver. They were there for ten years. Their daughter, Karen, and son, Peter, were born there and Billy stayed home to care for the children. The family loved the landscape and views. The children learned to ski and the family spent a lot of time on the slopes as well as camping.

After moving to Ottawa in 1959, the next big change came in 1969 when the family moved in the Black Forest area in Germany and the children became fluent in the language. The family also spent time on a farm near Renfrew and another farm near Almonte. While farming, they raised Maine Anjou cattle and sheep, baled a lot of hay, raised vegetables and grew flowers. After many years of farming, it was time to retire. The children were grown and living independently. Anne is a research scientist and works in risk evaluation. Karen runs conferences in hotels. Peter is a teacher.

An important part of Billy and Don's life was flying. Don loved flying and got his instructor's license, while Billy joined him and also became a pilot. They owned a single-engine Cessna 150 and Billy's furthest trip as a pilot was to the Caribbean. Also important in Billy's life was being a guide at both the Ottawa Museum of Science and the Aviation Museum. She loved teaching children worthwhile information because she loved learning new things herself.



It was during this time that Billy got her Canadian citizenship. However, most important to Billy is her large and agreeable family. Along with her three children, she has 7 grandchildren and 10 great- grandchildren. They all love to get together and have fun. Several family members live nearby and visit often, which is great because Billy loves to talk. She is shy to initiate, but more than happy to join in conversations

Billy is an avid reader, gardener and singer. She was part of Ottawa Choral Society and a soprano in church. Billy also volunteered with the Almonte Horticultural Society. She loved to entertain and cooked a mean roast beef, as well as cheese bread. Nowadays, Billy goes out to sit and enjoy the OVM gardens, which are amazing this year due to the heat, sun and rain. She even has a sunflower growing in the gardens. Billy is happy to live at OVM because her family can visit her at any time, she is well taken care of and it is a beautiful place to call home.
